Painting permissible dates are as follows, weather permitting.

- Wednesday, August 2
- Friday, August 4
- Monday, August 7

In order to paint your spot, you must turn in your completed parking permit application along with a design plan for approval, prior to completing your canvas, to Mrs. Hall. Parking spots will be taped off and you may only paint within the taped area on the above listed dates. THERE ARE PAINTED NUMBERS FOR EACH SPOT. PLEASE DO NOT PAINT BELOW OR BESIDE THOSE NUMBERS. YOUR DESIGN MUST STOP AT LEAST 4 INCHES ABOVE THOSE NUMBERS. No painting may take place on ANY date other than those listed above. All spots must be COMPLETED by Monday, August 7.

Designs should be in good taste, highlighting your accomplishment. There should not be any inappropriate innuendos or suggestions. You can paint about your success, arriving at this milestone or your personality reflection.

Paint requirements:

• Paint must be exterior all weather paint. This should be water based paint and not an oil based paint. We suggest you talk to the paint department about what you are doing and let them help you with paint, how much to purchase and colors. Spray paint is NOT allowed.

What to bring on paint day


- Paint and paint brushes or rollers, paint can opener, paint trays
- Masking tape or painters tape to tape off the lines.
- Broom to sweep off parking space and clean-up supplies.
- No air or airless paint sprayers permitted, NO spray paint.
- Trash bags
- Materials Needed and Suggestions:
- Paint: Exterior all weather paint, water based. Gallons may be purchased for backgrounds while pints may be purchased for details.
- Talk with your friends: If you are using the same colors then you could purchase the paint together and share.
- Chalk: Use chalk to draw what you want to paint on the solid background color and trace any writing. The chalk will wash off. You could also create stencils.
- Hula hoop (optional): A hula hoop is a great tool to use if you are having any sort of larger circle incorporated into your design.
- Cloths or paper towels: Painting is messy so make sure you have something to wipe your hands on like a cloth or paper towel.

STEPS

• Choose a design and draw it out. Fill out parking permit and submit drawn design to Mr. Jones for approval.

- Buy your supplies.
- Clean your assigned parking spot
- Paint your parking spot on the assigned dates.
